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## **NOTIFICATION OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S REQUEST TO CHANGE ELECTRIC RATES NO. A.20-07-009**

On July 10, 2020, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed the 2020 Power Charge Indifference Adjustment (PCIA) Balancing Account (CAPBA) Trigger Application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to change electric rates.

New rates will begin on October 1, 2020 for a 3-month period ending December 31, 2020.

### **HOW WILL THIS AFFECT BUNDLED CUSTOMER ELECTRIC BILLS?**

Most customers receive bundled electric service from SDG&E, meaning they receive electric generation and utility distribution company (UDC) services. A summary of the rate impact for these customers is provided in the table below. If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a residential bundled customer living in the inland climate zone and using 400 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly winter bill decrease of \$0.94, or 0.8%, from \$112.36 to \$111.42. A typical residential bundled customer living in the inland climate zone and using 400 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly summer bill decrease of \$0.95, or 0.9%, from \$111.71 to \$110.76. Individual customer bills may vary depending on energy usage.

### HOW WILL THIS AFFECT NON-BUNDLED CUSTOMER ELECTRIC BILLS?

Non-bundled customers include Direct Access (DA), Community Choice Aggregation (CCA), and other departing load customers who only receive electric UDC services from SDG&E. If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, these customers could see an average PCIA rate increase of 137%.

### CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to a judge, who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's application, modify or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners.

The Public Advocates Office may review this application. The Public Advocates Office is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities. They help obtain the lowest possible rate consistent with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals.
