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**NOTIFICATION OF  
SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S  
REQUEST TO INCREASE RATES  
ASSOCIATED WITH TREE TRIMMING  
NO. A.20-07-003**

On July 1, 2020, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking to increase rates to recover funds recorded in the Tree Trimming Balancing Account (TTBA). SDG&E is requesting recovery of \$10.4 million (or 0.2%) associated with additional spending in 2019 recorded in the TTBA.

**HOW WILL THIS AFFECT MY ELECTRIC BILL?**

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request for an electric rate increase for this application, the average bill for a typical bundled residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 400 kWh per month would increase \$0.29 (or 0.3%) in 2021. Individual customer bills may vary. **New rates would become effective in January 2021.**

The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners.

The Public Advocates Office is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals.
