On September 23, 2019, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed Application No. A.19-09-014 with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting approval to eliminate seasonal differentials in all of its residential rates. Currently, SDG&E differentiates its residential electricity rates by season, with higher rates in the summer and lower rates in the winter. SDG&E's proposal would equalize residential rates by lowering summer rates and raising winter rates so that customers experience a single set of electric rates throughout the year. This proposal will not affect residential baseline usage allowances, which will continue to vary by season. SDG&E requests that the proposed rates be implemented before Summer 2020.

ESTIMATED IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

SDG&E's application does not increase the revenue that the utility is authorized to collect through its rates. If the CPUC approves SDG&E's application, a typical non-CARE residential customer on basic service living in either the inland or coastal climate zones and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month will see an increase of 4.1% to their winter electric bill from \$145 to \$151 and will see a decrease of 4.6% to their summer bill from \$157 to \$150. On average, a customer would not see any significant bill impact on an annual basis. Individual customer bills may vary.

CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any of the five CPUC Commissioners may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the Commissioners at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Public Advocates Office (Cal PA) may review this application. Cal PA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. Cal PA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
