NOTIFICATION OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S REQUEST TO DECREASE RATES FOR 2021 APPLICATION NO. A.20-04-014

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) determines the amount of money a utility is allowed to collect through rates to operate and maintain the utility system in a given year. In this 2021 Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Application, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) is requesting a rate decrease estimated to be \$543.028 million (or 11.24%) in 2021 to establish revenues for that year. New rates would become effective in January 2021.

HOW DOES THIS IMPACT MY ELECTRIC RATES?

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request for an electric rate decrease, the winter bill for a typical non-California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 400 kWh per month is estimated to decrease \$9.95 (or 9.2%) in 2021. The winter bill for lower-income residential customers enrolled in the CARE program is estimated to decrease \$6.47 (or 9.3%) in 2021. Individual customer bills may vary.

SDG&E's request will not have any impact on gas rates.

HOW DOES THE REST OF THE PROCESS WORK?

This Application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence, and other related documents, that are necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision.

After considering all proposals and evidence, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Public Advocates Office (Cal Advocates) is currently reviewing this application. Cal Advocates is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals.
