NOTICE OF APPLICATION SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S REQUEST TO INCREASE RATES ASSOCIATED WITH TREE TRIMMING APPLICATION A.22-12-008

WHY AM I RECEIVING THIS NOTICE?

On December 9, 2022, San Diego Gas & Electric Company® (SDG&E®) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking to increase rates to recover funds recorded in the Tree Trimming Balancing Account (TTBA). The application is requesting a total of \$70.3 million, associated with additional spending in 2020 and 2021 recorded in the TTBA.

If the CPUC approves this application, SDG&E will recover forecasted costs in electric rates over a 2-year period beginning January 1, 2024. This will increase your monthly bill.

WHY IS SDG&E REQUESTING THIS RATE INCREASE?

- SDG&E is required by CPUC Decision (D.) 19-09-051 to file an application seeking recovery of costs associated with tree trimming when those costs exceed a certain threshold.
- SDG&E has experienced additional costs associated with tree trimming initiatives designed to reduce wildfire risk and intended to promote safety, as well as labor market changes required by statute.

HOW COULD THIS AFFECT MY MONTHLY ELECTRIC RATES?

If SDG&E's rate request is approved by the CPUC, the average residential monthly bill using 400 kWh per month would increase by approximately \$1.11 or 0.7% per month.

Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding will review SDG&E's application, including the Public Advocates Office, which is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers
