APPLICATION OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY (U 902 E) FOR AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT OPTIONAL PILOT PROGRAM TO INCREASE CUSTOMER ACCESS TO SOLAR GENERATED ELECTRICITY

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Pursuant to California Public Utilities Code¹ §§ 454, 701 and Commission Rules 2.1-2.3 and 3.2, San Diego Gas & Electric Company ("SDG&E") hereby submits this *Application For Authority To Implement Optional Pilot Program to Increase Customer Access to Solar Generated Electricity* ("Application").

I. OVERVIEW OF APPLICATION AND SUPPORTING TESTIMONY

SDG&E's most recent General Rate Case ("GRC") phase 2 application stated SDG&E's intent to submit to the Commission a program giving customers that cannot install rooftop solar (such as renters) or cannot afford such an investment an option to access solar power.² To that end, this Application submits for Commission approval two pilot programs which will give all customers the opportunity to access solar energy through their retail electric service by SDG&E. One program, "*SunRate*," is a green tariff program permitting bundled residential customers to purchase electricity from solar projects located in SDG&E's service territory. The other, entitled "*Share the Sun*," permits customers to contract directly with solar provider/developers for solar-generated electricity to be delivered by SDG&E. If approved, both programs will be introduced to the public under the umbrella term "*connected..... to the sun*." The proposed programs would take effect following Commission approval of these proposals.

In support of the Application, SDG&E attaches the testimony of the following witnesses,

organized by Chapter as shown:

<u>Chapter 1</u>: (James P. Avery) provides an overview of the testimony and the policy considerations supporting the proposed pilot programs;

<u>Chapter 2</u>: (Dawn Osborne) describes, for each program, benefits, program structure, enrollment process, outreach and administration;

<u>Chapter 3</u>: (Chris Yunker) describes the calculation of solar commodity costs to account for a customer's election to be served by solar energy as opposed to SDG&E's bundled portfolio of resources, and how non-participating customer costs will be unaffected by such transactions; in addition, he describes the contracting and pricing of local solar energy from providers and the sale of such energy to customers.

All references to testimony herein are to the foregoing, unless otherwise stated.

II. EFFECT ON DISTRIBUTION AND COMMODITY REVENUES AND RATES

If approved, the proposed programs would not impact distribution and commodity revenue requirements collected through current distribution and commodity rates.

III. INTRODUCTION TO PROPOSED PILOT PROGRAMS

The *connected..... to the sun* options proposed in this Application are detailed in the prepared testimony of James P. Avery, Dawn Osborne and Chris Yunker served with this Application as described in section I. above. The two options and supporting rationale are summarized below.

A. These customer options are part of SDG&E's effort to support solar generation

The testimony of James P. Avery submitted herewith reviews SDG&E's leadership in supporting solar generation.³

More must be done to ensure that all residential customers (including those that do not own homes, do not have south facing roofs, who cannot qualify for or do not want to make a

long-term commitment to a solar purchase or lease) have access to solar power. The instant Application aims to address these long-term barriers to customer solar access by proposing a way for *all* residential customers to obtain distributed solar energy directly from SDG&E. SDG&E's proposal will provide residential customers – whether they own a home or rent an apartment, and without regard to whether they can afford a solar investment – access to solar energy, located where it will have maximum solar production to minimize cost to customers. Importantly, this proposal will not rely on subsidies from other customers.

B. The *SunRate* proposal will allow customer purchases from a portfolio of local solar projects.

SDG&E's *SunRate* program will allow customers to purchase energy from local solar projects under contract to SDG&E. Customers will have the option to buy solar energy to cover all or just a portion of their conventional energy usage. The program is designed to be simple, and allow customers to take their solar service with them if they move to another location served by SDG&E. Customers will have the option to purchase all or a portion of their total energy requirements from local solar projects on a month-to-month basis, or under a 5, 10 or 15 year contract. SDG&E will reallocate up to 10 MW of local solar projects from the existing portfolio for this program. Participants will pay a monthly subscription cost on their SDG&E bill. The average monthly cost to participate in the program will depend upon their monthly energy use and the amount of solar energy the customer subscribes to.

For the purposes of providing bundled ratepayers renewable energy through *SunRate*, SDG&E will allocate up to 21,900 MWh per year (approximately 10 MW at an assumed 25% capacity factor) of solar energy from projects located within SDG&E's service territory originally contracted for and approved by the Commission to meet the requirement to procure Eligible Renewable Energy Resources pursuant to the California Renewable Portfolio Standard (Public Utilities Code §§ 399.11 *et seq.*), Decision ("D.") 03-06-071, or other applicable law.

A customer's participation in the program provides them with "green" energy and therefore such energy will not be included under SDG&E's Renewable Portfolio Standard ("RPS") requirements. To this end, SDG&E will retire the Renewable Energy Credits ("RECs") associated with the customer's participation on their behalf through the Western Renewable Energy Generation Information System ("WREGIS"), providing the customer with assurance



that their energy purchases are renewable energy that are not part of SDG&E's power purchases to meet RPS requirements.

SDG&E intends to manage its portfolio to take into account a reasonable project failure rate and the capacity needed to serve *SunRate* customers. If SDG&E fails to meet RPS requirements because of volumes allocated to *SunRate* customers, it requests that the Commission waive the application of any associated penalties or other enforcement action related to the level of energy provided under *SunRate*. SDG&E will voluntarily retire RECs equivalent to any shortfall within a three-year period to ensure meeting the goal to increase renewable energy serving San Diego.

Finally, SDG&E seeks approval to redirect through an Advice Letter an additional 10MW per year in subsequent years to the extent the initial *SunRate* offering is fully subscribed.

The following illustrates, at a high level, the *SunRate* proposal:



Customers can purchase local solar energy from SDG&E at the solar portfolio cost. A minimum one-year subscription commitment is required. Subscription's monthly cost updates annually for annual subscribers and remains fixed for long-term subscribers.

C. Share the Sun provides opportunity for solar developers to participate

SDG&E's *Share the Sun* program will allow solar providers to construct and sell the rights to the capacity of their solar facilities to SDG&E customers. Under this program, solar providers can:


- Build solar projects on SDG&E land, and/or
- Identify and develop their own project sites.

Solar providers participating in the program will contract with SDG&E customers to sell the rights to the capacity produced by such projects. The solar providers will provide proof of such transaction to SDG&E to enable SDG&E to credit the customer's monthly bill for the contracted value of the energy produced by the customer's portion of the solar project.

Under the proposed Share the Sun pilot, SDG&E will:

- Purchase the solar energy generated by the customer's subscribed portion of the solar project at the Commission authorized renewable Feed-in tariff ("FiT") rate in compliance with SB32⁴. SDG&E will retire the Renewable Energy Credits ("REC") associated with such energy on behalf of the customer and shall not count them toward SDG&E's RPS compliance.
- Provide a monthly bill credit to customers for their subscribed energy based upon their kWh purchased and price of energy.
- Procure all unsubscribed solar energy from solar developers at Commission authorized Renewable FiT rate established for SB32 compliance. The RECs will count towards SDG&E's RPS if needed or will be counted above SDG&E's RPS requirement.
- Continue to work with the solar industry to ensure the program remains viable, and sustainable.

The following illustrates, at a high level, the *Share the Sun* proposal:



Share the Sun Proposal

RECs associated with subscribed energy are retired by SDG&E on behalf of the customer. Customer subscriptions do not count toward SDG&E's RPS requirements. Unsubscribed shares count towards SDG&E's 60 MW Renewable FiT requirements if FiT cap not yet reached.

The generation owned by participating solar providers will meet criteria similar to that required by the renewable FiT program at the time that the *Share the Sun* program is launched.⁵ Providers will interconnect to SDG&E's system in the same manner that is required by the Commission-approved renewable FiT process at the time the program is approved and launched.

While SDG&E has met with representatives of the solar industry and solar stakeholders to get feedback and input on this program as described in the prepared testimony of James P. Avery submitted with this Application, SDG&E requests that the Commission convene workshops to collaborative develop certain details of this program, including those related to customer contracts with the provider/developer. The nature of the requested workshops is set forth in the prepared testimony of Dawn Osborne submitted with this Application.

IV. RELIEF REQUESTED

SDG&E respectfully requests that, in accordance with the proposed schedule, the Commission issue a decision:

- 1. Authorizing SDG&E's *SunRate* pilot as proposed;
- 2. Authorizing SDG&E's Share the Sun pilot as proposed;
- Authorizing SDG&E to expand, via annual advice letter, its *SunRate* and *Share the Sun* proposal each by up to 10 MW annually;
- Authorizing SDG&E the flexibility to adjust the *SunRate* program between residential and commercial customers as described in the testimony supporting this Application; and
- 5. Such other relief as is necessary and proper.

V. STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Category, Need for Hearings, Issues and Schedule - Rule 2.1(c)

1. Category

SDG&E proposes that this proceeding be categorized as "ratesetting."

2. Need for Hearings

SDG&E believes that evidentiary hearings may be required.

B. Authority - Rule 2.1

This Application is filed pursuant to P.U. Code §§ 454 and 701, and in compliance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

SDG&E is engaged in the business of providing electric service to portions of southern Orange County and electric and gas service throughout San Diego County. The exact legal name of the Applicant is San Diego Gas & Electric Company. The location of Applicant's principal place of business is 8306 Century Park Court, San Diego, California. SDG&E's attorney in this matter is E. Gregory Barnes.

D. Organization and Qualification to Transact Business – Rule 2.2

A certified copy of SDG&E's Restated Articles of Incorporation, as last amended, presently in effect and certified by the California Secretary of State, was previously filed with the Commission on August 31, 2009, in connection with SDG&E's Application No. 09-08-019, and is incorporated herein by reference.

E. Balance Sheet and Income Statement – Rule 3.2(a)(1)

SDG&E's Balance Sheet, Income Statement and Financial Statement for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2011 are included in Appendix A.

F. Rates - Rules 3.2(a)(2) and 3.2(a)(3)

The rate options contained in this Application do not request an increase in currently effective electric distribution or commodity rates. A statement of presently effective rates in included as Attachment B.

G. Property and Equipment - Rule 3.2(a)(4)

A general description of SDG&E's property and equipment was previously filed with the Commission on October 5, 2001, in connection with SDG&E's Application No. 01-10-005 and

is incorporated herein by reference. A statement of Original Cost and Depreciation Reserve for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2011 is attached as Appendix C.

H. Summary of Earnings - Rules 3.2(a)(5) and (6)

SDG&E's Summary of Earnings for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2011 is included in Appendix D.

I. Depreciation - Rule 3.2(a)(7)

For financial statement purposes, depreciation of utility plant has been computed on a straight-line remaining life basis, at rates based on the estimated useful lives of plant properties. For federal income tax accrual purposes, SDG&E generally computes depreciation using the straight-line method for tax property additions prior to 1954, and liberalized depreciation, which includes Class Life and Asset Depreciation Range Systems, on tax property additions after 1954 and prior to 1981. For financial reporting and rate-fixing purposes, "flow through accounting" has been adopted for such properties. For tax property additions in years 1981 through 1986, SDG&E has computed its tax depreciation using the Accelerated Cost Recovery Systems and, since 1982, has normalized the effects of the depreciation differences in accordance with the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 and the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

J. Proxy Statement - Rule 3.2(a)(8)

A copy of SDG&E's most recent Proxy Statement, dated April 27, 2011, as sent to all shareholders of SDG&E's parent company, Sempra Energy, was provided to the Commission on May 4, 2011, and is incorporated herein by reference.

K. Pass Through of Costs - Rule 3.2(a)(10)

This Application reflects and passes through to customers cost and revenue requirement requests for increased costs to SDG&E for services or commodities furnished by it, as described herein.

L. Service and Notice - Rule 1.9

This Application will initiate a new proceeding. As such, there is currently no official service list in effect. Instead, SDG&E is serving this Application on all parties to A.10-12-005/A.10-12-006, SDG&E's most recent GRC proceeding, A.08-11-014, SDG&E's most recent Rate Design Window ("RDW") proceeding, and A.11-10-002, SDG&E's pending

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GRC phase 2 proceeding. SDG&E will also provide service to the state/government entities listed in Appendix E.

VI. CONCLUSION

SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY requests that the Commission 1) authorize the proposed pilot programs described above; and 2) grant such additional relief as the Commission believes is just and reasonable.
