I. INTRODUCTION

My testimony describes the San Diego Gas & Electric Company ("SDG&E") cost recovery mechanism intended for the "connected.....to the sun" program proposed in this Application in compliance with Section 2833 (q) of Senate Bill ("SB") 43, specifically:

A participating utility shall track and account for all revenues and costs to ensure that the utility recovers the actual costs of the utility's green tariff shared renewables program and that all costs and revenues are fully transparent and auditable.

SDG&E requests the authority to open a new Memorandum Account ("MA") to track and account for program revenues and costs, defined as 1) implementation and management of the program and 2) solar generation for the program.¹

This two-way interest bearing MA is needed to record the incremental program costs pursuant to the requirements of SB 43 and the revenues collected from participants. SDG&E proposes to recover costs only through participating customers for the purpose of ensuring nonparticipant ratepayer indifference.
