
## Understanding your SDG&E bill




Below are summarized sections of your bill. Details about your energy use such as when and how your home uses energy, and a bill forecast for the month, are available in My Account, SDG&E's online energy-management tool. To get started, you just need your account number. Visit **sdge.com/MyAccount**.



- Due date and amount due for quick reference.
- Summary of charges shows usage and cost totals at a glance.
- Messages provides information about your account, programs or services.
- Usage history compares your energy use to previous months and the same month a year ago to help you track how you've been using energy.
- 5 Online bills We encourage you to help save paper by going paperless with My Account, or check with your home banking provider to see if they offer e-bills from SDG&E.

- Gas service, baseline allowance and meter reading information.
- **7** Gas rate information and associated costs are detailed to help you understand your energy use.
- Payment options presented so you can decide the best way to pay your bill every month.

- 10 **Electric service,** baseline allowance and meter reading information.
- 11 Your circuit and block number You can use your circuit and block number to see how long a planned or unplanned outage is expected to last.
- 12 Electric rate information detail and associated costs are displayed to help you understand total costs for electricity.
- 13 Breakdown of current charges itemizes individual components included in your energy rates.

14 Residential electric rates are tiered so the cost per kWh goes up when your overall electricity use rises from one usage level to the next. There are up to two tiers where your usage can fall into.

The electricity price by tier changes during the year, based on the season and other factors. The costs shown are for illustration purposes only.

**15 High Usage Charge** A state-mandated High Usage Charge will apply to residential tiered customers whose electricity use is more than four times the amount of their Baseline Allowance.
