

Bundled Electric Rate Change Alert

In December 2025, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letter 4757-E](#) to consolidate previously approved electric rate change requests. As a result, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates will increase by approximately 4.7 cents/kWh or 11.4% from 41.0 cents/kWh to 45.7 cents/kWh.¹

A bundled customer is one who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below.

Unbundled Electric Rate Change Alert

In December 2025, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letter 4757-E](#) to consolidate previously approved electric rate change requests. As a result, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates will increase by approximately 2.9 cents/kWh or 11.6% from 25.2 cents/kWh to 28.2 cents/kWh.¹

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from another provider such as a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity generator.² Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below.
