



Bundled Electric Rate Change Alert

In March 2026, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letters 4791-E and 4791-E-A](#) to change electric rates. As a result, SDG&E's bundled residential average electric rates will increase by approximately 0.7 cents/kWh or 1.5% from 45.7 cents/kWh to 46.4 cents/kWh.¹

A bundled customer is someone who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below. **Despite the rate increase**, the typical bundled residential customer will see a bill decrease primarily due to the Super-Off-Peak (SOP) period expansion, where a greater portion of the monthly usage is charged the lower-cost SOP rates.

Unbundled Electric Rate Change Alert

In March 2026, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed [Advice Letters 4791-E and 4791-E-A](#) to change electric rates. As a result, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates will increase by approximately 0.7 cents/kWh or 2.3% from 28.2 cents/kWh to 28.8 cents/kWh.¹

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from another provider such as a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity generator.² Average residential monthly bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below. **Despite the rate increase**, the typical unbundled residential customer will see minimal to no bill changes due to the rate design changes implemented.
