



Bundled Electric Rate Change Alert

Throughout the year, we submit requests to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to change our rates. On December 29, 2023, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed Advice Letter 4344-E to consolidate all the previously approved electric requests. As a result, SDG&E’s bundled residential average electric rates will decrease by approximately 7.0 cents/kWh or -16.2% from 43.2 cents/kWh to 36.2 cents/kWh.¹ A bundled customer is one who receives both their electric delivery and electric generation from SDG&E. Estimated bill impacts for a typical bundled customer are shown below.

The primary drivers for this rate decrease include the following:

- Increased forecasted sales, which allow for costs to be spread over more kilowatt hours, decreasing rates
- Decreased costs of purchasing electricity
- Reduced costs for public purpose programs and transmission
- Delayed decisions with our regulator

There are still pending decisions that may be implemented into rates throughout 2024.³ The timing and the final outcome of these decisions is currently unknown, but you will be notified in future rate alerts. More detailed information can be found in Advice Letter 4344-E.

Unbundled Electric Rate Change Alert

Throughout the year, we submit requests to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to change our rates. On December 29, 2023, San Diego Gas & Electric® (SDG&E®) filed Advice Letter 4344-E to consolidate all the previously approved requests. As a result, SDG&E's residential average electric delivery rates will decrease by approximately 2.4 cents/kWh or -10.5% from 23.5 cents/kWh to 21.1 cents/kWh.¹

An unbundled customer is someone who receives their electric generation from a Community Choice Aggregator (CCA). For additional information on your electric generation rate, please reach out to your electricity provider.² Estimated bill impacts for a typical unbundled customer are shown below.
