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## NOTICE OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S RATE INCREASE REQUEST

**San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E) Smart Meter 2.0 Application to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) A.25-12-012**

### What is being requested?

SDG&E® is requesting an increase in revenue of approximately \$1,287 million over the life of the Smart Meter 2.0 project to replace its 1.0 gas and electric smart meters beginning as early as 2027. Many of these meters were installed between 2009 and 2011 and are nearing or at the end of their useful lifespan, suffering from technical and operational problems. They will be replaced with Smart Meter 2.0, which will provide customers with improved access to real-time energy data and insights into the devices and appliances driving their own energy consumption.

### How would this impact the average residential customer?

If the request is approved by the CPUC, all residential electric customers using 400 kWh per month would see a monthly bill increase of approximately \$2.53. This increase will be phased in beginning as early as 2027 through 2031.<sup>1</sup> The actual impact will vary based on usage, baseline territory, and other factors.

### Illustrative Proposed Electric Rate Impacts by Customer Class<sup>2</sup>

Customer Class	Proposed Rate Increase (¢/kWh)	Percentage Rate Increase (%)
Residential	0.637	1.70%
Small Commercial	0.611	1.64%
Medium and Large C&I	0.351	1.04%
Agricultural	0.361	1.37%
Lighting	0.719	2.01%
<b>System Total</b>	<b>0.482</b>	<b>1.37%</b>

If the request is approved by the CPUC, the typical residential gas customer using 24 therms per month would see a monthly bill increase of approximately \$3.18. This increase will be phased in beginning as early as 2027 through 2031.<sup>1</sup> The actual impact will vary based on usage, rate changes and other factors.
