**NOTIFICATION OF  
SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S  
REQUEST TO INCREASE  
ELECTRIC RATES FOR ITS EXPEDITED  
ENERGY RESOURCE RECOVERY  
ACCOUNT TRIGGER MECHANISM  
APPLICATION NO. A.17-05-012**

On May 17, 2017, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed its Expedited Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Trigger Application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for approval to increase electric rates. The ERRA was established by the CPUC to compare the utility's fuel and purchased power revenues against its costs.

Assembly Bill (AB) 57 requires utilities to stay within 5% of their prior year's generation revenues. Expedited ERRA triggers occur when the utility reaches an undercollection or overcollection of 4% and is projected to exceed the 5% trigger. SDG&E's balance exceeded the 5% trigger in March 2017 and SDG&E is not anticipating a self-correction within the prescribed 120-day period. Accordingly, SDG&E is required to file this Expedited ERRA Trigger Application, and is seeking approval to collect the latest projected ERRA balance through July 2017. Listed below is a rate impact chart reflecting the collection of the currently forecasted undercollected balance for July 2017, of \$120 million. These impacts assume the new rates will begin on November 1, 2017, to be collected over a 14-month period ending December 31, 2018.

**ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS**

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical non-CARE residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see a monthly winter bill increase of \$3.00, or 2.5%. A typical monthly electric bill could increase from \$122.40 to \$125.40. Increases in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses.

**CPUC PROCESS**

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary hearings may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) may review this application. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. ORA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
