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**SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S
REQUEST TO INCREASE ELECTRIC RATES TO EXTEND
AND MODIFY THE POWER YOUR DRIVE PILOT
APPLICATION NO. A.19-10-012**

On October 28, 2019, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E®) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting approval to increase rates to fund a transportation electrification program that promotes electric vehicle (EV) charging at workplaces and multi-unit dwelling (MUD) locations. In this application, the Power Your Drive (PYD) Extension Program will continue to support and accelerate the growth of Transportation Electrification by ensuring there are no gaps in program offerings and promoting widespread EV adoption in support of meeting California's greenhouse gas reduction goals.¹

The proposed funding for the PYD Extension Program will, among other things:

1. Cover costs associated with implementing the program such as site selection, engineering design, construction and EV charging infrastructure material and labor costs.
2. Provide EV charging stations at MUD locations and rebates for workplace charging stations that will be maintained by SDG&E and the workplace site owner respectively.
3. Ensure the safe, reliable and efficient integration of EVs to the grid by providing electrical infrastructure such as trench work, conduit, conductor and transformers from the distribution system to the participating customer's property.

SDG&E also seeks authorization to record the requested amount of \$125.6 million in a new regulatory account, and to be recovered annually in electric distribution rates starting January 1, 2021.

1. The Power Your Drive Pilot, approved in Decision 16-01-045, is an electric vehicle infrastructure program. The Power Your Drive Pilot supports vehicle charging at workplace locations and multi-unit dwelling locations by providing charging stations, education and support to customers. The Pilot has deployed approximately 3,000 charging stations at approximately 250 customer sites.

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical non-CARE (California Alternate Rates for Energy) residential customer living in both the inland and coastal climate zones and using 500 kilowatt-hours per month could see an annual bill increase of \$0.32, or 0.21%. A typical current monthly bill could increase from \$150.14 to \$150.46.

The percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the changes that you may see on your bill. Changes in individual bills will also depend on how much electricity each customer uses. The chart shown below illustrates the impact of rate increases on the various customer classes.

CPUC PROCESS

This application will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary hearings (EHs) may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These EHs are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any of the five CPUC Commissioners may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

The Public Advocates Office (CalPA) may review this application. CalPA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. CalPA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering.
