**WHY AM I RECEIVING THIS REVISED NOTICE?**

On September 8, 2022, San Diego Gas & Electric® Company (SDG&E®), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas®) and Southwest Gas Corporation (Southwest Gas) filed a Joint Application (A.22-09-006) to Establish Hydrogen Blending Demonstration Projects with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). As part of the application, SDG&E is requesting a total of \$15 million in forecasted revenue requirement: \$3.3 million in 2023, \$7.6 million in 2024, \$0.7 million in 2025, \$2.3 million in 2026, \$0.2 million in 2027, and \$1.0 million in 2028-2097.

If the CPUC approves this application, SDG&E will recover forecasted costs in gas rates over a five year period beginning after approval of the application. This will impact your monthly bill.

**WHY IS SDG&E REQUESTING THESE CHANGES?**

SDG&E is committed to helping its customers safely and affordably meet the state's decarbonization goals. As such, SDG&E is requesting authorization to establish a hydrogen blending demonstration project that would help inform on a safe hydrogen injection standard to support the potential and phased integration of hydrogen into the existing natural gas system. The application covers the costs associated with planning and implementing the blending project.

## HOW COULD THIS AFFECT MY MONTHLY ELECTRIC AND GAS RATES?

If SDG&E's rate request is approved by the CPUC, the average Non-CARE residential monthly bill using 24 therms per month would increase by approximately \$0.15 or 0.3% per month in 2024. The proposed average rates shown below are for 2024, the highest revenue requirement year.

This application will be assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge, who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt SDG&E's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed

decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding may review the joint application, including the Public Advocates Office. The Public Advocates Office is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
