

What is the California Climate Credit?

A Message from the California Public Utilities Commission

This month* your utility bill will include a credit identified as the "California Climate Credit." Your household and millions of others throughout the state will receive this credit on your utility bills.

The California Climate Credit is part of California's efforts to fight climate change. This credit is from the California Cap-and-Trade Program, which requires power plants, fuel providers, and large industrial facilities that emit greenhouse gases to buy carbon pollution allowances. The credit on your bill is designed to help utility customers during the transition to a low-carbon future.

In 2023, the CPUC temporarily authorized SDG&E® to distribute the California Climate Credits in February, March and October. Beginning in 2024, the California Climate Credits will revert to the original April and October distribution.
