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## **NOTICE OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY'S RATE INCREASE REQUEST**

### **San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E) Low-Income Assistance Programs and Budgets for Program Years 2028 - 2033 Application to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) A.26-01-010**

#### **What is being requested?**

SDG&E® is requesting a total revenue increase of \$124 million<sup>1</sup> for program years 2028 through 2033 to (1) continue providing energy savings programs and bill discounts for income qualified customers through initiatives like Energy Savings Assistance (ESA), California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE), and Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) and (2) expand outreach and enrollment efforts by partnering with local organizations to better serve our diverse communities.

#### **How would this impact the average residential customer?**

If the request is approved, the typical non-CARE residential electric customer using 400 kWh per month would see a monthly bill increase of approximately \$0.58. This increase will be phased in beginning as early as 2028 through 2033. The actual impact will vary based on usage, baseline territory, and other factors.

<sup>1</sup>The \$124 million represents the total incremental increase in annual costs over the six-year period from program years 2028 through 2033, relative to 2026.

If the request is approved, the typical non-CARE residential gas customer using 24 therms per month would see a monthly bill increase of approximately \$0.47. This increase will be phased in beginning as early as 2028 through 2033. The actual impact will vary based on usage, baseline territory, and other factors.
